



Dudzinski Named To NASWA's UI Information Technology Support Center Steering Committee

WETHERSFIELD, March 4, 2019 – Daryle Dudzinski, Deputy Commissioner at the Connecticut Department of Labor, has been appointed by the National Association of State Workforce Agencies (NASWA) to serve on the group's Information Technology Support Center Steering Committee. Dudzinski, who has an extensive background working with Connecticut's Unemployment Insurance (UI) program, will serve as a UI Director on the committee.

According to NASWA Board President Jon Pierpont, the Information Technology Support Center is a collaboration of state workforce agencies, the U.S. Department of Labor and private sector partners. Their goal is to make available the appropriate application of information technology that states can adopt to provide more accurate, efficient, cost-effective and timely service to UI customers. The steering committee acts as a Board of Governors in guiding the organization's work and initiatives.

A graduate of Central Connecticut State University, Dudzinski holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting. Prior to his current position as Deputy Commissioner, he served as Director of Labor Operations, overseeing the agency's Unemployment Insurance Benefits Division, and Employment Services offered through the American Job Centers, Business Services and Veterans' divisions.

Dudzinski's term will run through September 2019 with an option to continue for an additional three-year term.
