The following schedule of work experience is intended as a guide. It need not be followed in any particular sequence, and it is understood that some adjustments may be necessary in the hours allotted for different work experience. In all cases, the apprentice is to receive sufficient experience to become a fully competent and use good workmanship in all work processes which are a part of the trade. The apprentice will be fully instructed in safety and OSHA requirements.
