June 17 CONN-OSHA Breakfast Addresses Fall Prevention & Proactive Protection Programs

WETHERSFIELD, June 12, 2014 – Have you ever considered the dangers that could result from a fall? While many of us give it little thought, statistics show that accidents of this sort are very common and the consequences can often be serious.

Michael Ziskin, President of Field Safety Corporation of North Branford, CT, will discuss the subject – from trip to freefall and rescue – during a June 17 Breakfast Roundtable Discussion meeting sponsored by the Connecticut Department of Labor’s Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CONN-OSHA).

The event will run from 8:15 to 9:45 a.m., at the Labor Department’s main office in Wethersfield, located at 200 Folly Brook Boulevard.

“Most of us can relate to the consequences that may occur when we fall,” explains CONN-OSHA Occupational Safety Training Specialist and Roundtable project coordinator, John Able. “Our guest speaker will discuss these realities and review safety compliance requirements, best management practices, and common sense approaches to manage fall hazards.”

This month’s presentation is geared toward both the general and construction industries, and is based on Ziskin’s experience in performing fall prevention and protection studies, designing fall protective systems, and delivering training and developing programs to the business community.
