Electronic Injury & Illness Recordkeeping Topic of Nov. 21 CONN-OSHA Roundtable

WETHERSFIELD, November 15, 2017 – *Electronic Injury and Illness Recording* will be explored at the November 21 Breakfast Roundtable Discussion Group sponsored by the Connecticut Department of Labor’s Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CONN-OSHA).

Guest speaker is Catherine Zinsser, Occupational Safety Training Specialist with the agency. Geared for employers, human resource professionals and small business owners, the presentation and roundtable discussion will be held from 8:15 to 9:45 a.m. at the Labor Department’s Wethersfield office, 200 Folly Brook Boulevard.

“New rules issued by the federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration now require certain employers in ‘high risk industries’ to electronically submit their 2016 injury and illness data from the OSHA Form 300A,” explains John Able, CONN-OSHA Occupational Safety Training Specialist and Roundtable coordinator. “Since the 2016 filing is required by December 1, we thought this was a timely topic for the roundtable. Catherine will outline those establishments required to comply with the recordkeeping regulation, provide guidance and reporting schedules for 2018, and discuss how reporting may differ depending on number of employees.”
