March 8 CONN-OSHA Workshop Offers Guidance To Ensure Construction Site Safety

WETHERSFIELD, February 22, 2017 – Being aware of your surroundings, and the potential hazards and mishaps that can result on a worksite if safety precautions are not followed, can make the difference between life and death.

Construction Site Safety, and the four areas that managers, first line supervisors and construction employees should focus upon, will be discussed at the March 8 workshop offered by the Connecticut Department of Labor’s Division of Occupational Safety and Health (CONN-OSHA). Offered from 9 a.m. to noon, it will be held at the agency’s Wethersfield Central Office, 200 Folly Brook Boulevard.

“It is critical that every person on a construction job site have a clear understanding of the potential hazards that can exist, the ability to recognize these hazards, and the knowledge to minimize exposure to hazards by practicing proper and safe work procedures,” explains CONN-OSHA Occupational Safety Training Specialist John Able, who will facilitate the session.
