



November Workshops Scheduled in Hamden *CTWorks* Center

The no-cost workshops will be held in the office, located at 37 Marne Street. November 1:

Making Sense of Retirement: Participants will learn important information about investment for retirement during this 2 to 3 p.m. workshop. At its conclusion, each participant will be able to explain the importance of setting goals for retirement, understand concepts of risk tolerance and time horizon and will also be able to describe the value of a tax-deferred investment. They will also be able to identify various investments available for retirement and appreciate the importance of diversification.

November 2:

Internet Job Search: This workshop, which is scheduled from 9 to 11 a.m., will give participants an overview of job search strategies using the Internet, and will also provide them with information about the most helpful sites to visit.

November 3:

Foundations of Investing: This workshop is geared towards people who would like an overview of investing, including key terms and investment types. *Foundations of Investing* covers the basics features of bonds, stocks and mutual funds, as well as the importance of asset allocation. It runs from 2 to 3 p.m.

November 4:

Job Search Strategies: This 9 a.m. to noon workshop gives attendees an overview of job search strategies, as well pointers concerning telephone skills, networking, the hidden job market and interviewing techniques.

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November 7:

Interviewing Techniques and Salary Negotiations: During this 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. workshop, participants will learn the particulars of interview preparation and techniques. Attendees will also discover the best way to respond to questions from an interviewer, how to negotiate a “win-win” package and learn what to say when and how.
