**GOV. MALLOY SIGNS ORDERS EXTENDING DEADLINES FOR PERSONAL
PROPERTY TAX DECLARATIONS, UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FILINGS**

Signs Executive Orders No. 13 & 14

(HARTFORD, CT) – Governor Dannel P. Malloy on Wednesday afternoon signed two separate executive orders extending to November 15 the deadlines by which both personal property tax declarations and unemployment insurance tax filings must be reported.

“Understanding the emergency situation as a result of this weekend’s unprecedented snowstorm that both residents and businesses are currently coping with, the administration feels that it is in the best interests to extend these deadlines and allow adequate time for them to be filed,” Governor Malloy said.

Under current state statutes, personal property tax declarations were required to be filed by November 1, and unemployment insurance tax filings by October 31.

The state of emergency declaration Governor Malloy signed Saturday in response to this weekend’s severe snowstorm provides him with certain emergency powers he may utilize in response, including the suspension or modification of certain state statutes.

The orders are the 13th and 14th Governor Malloy has signed during his term.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 14

WHEREAS, a declaration of civil preparedness emergency was issued by the Governor on October 29, 2011 due to a severe snow storm and unprecedented power outages experienced throughout the state;

WHEREAS, Connecticut General Statutes section 28-9(b) authorizes and empowers the Governor to take such steps as are reasonably necessary in light of such emergency to protect the health, safety and welfare of the people of the state, and to modify and suspend in whole or in part, any statute, regulation or requirement or part thereof, whenever the Governor is of the opinion that it is in conflict with the efficient and expeditious execution of civil preparedness functions;

WHEREAS, severe weather conditions and fallen trees have resulted in continuing widespread power outages in the state, and limited transportation within the state;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 31-225(a) of the General Statutes, contributing employers who are subject to the Unemployment Compensation Act, shall pay their contributions quarterly;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 31-225(c) of the General Statutes, each contribution return and payment shall be made on or before the last day of the month next following the end of the period of employment with respect to which it is made;

WHEREAS, due to the emergency conditions caused by the storm, many employers were unable to make their unemployment insurance tax filings and payments in a timely manner;

WHEREAS, in light of the emergency conditions, it is appropriate to extend the date for filing and paying such contributions to November 15, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dannel P. Malloy, Governor of the State of Connecticut, by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT** the **modification of the following statute, or requirements under the following conditions for the reasons stated above:**

Except as otherwise stated in this Order, Section 31-225(c) of the General Statutes is modified to the extent that the deadline for Unemployment Insurance tax filings and payments due by October 31, 2011, has been extended to November 15, 2011, *nunc pro tunc*.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon filing with Office of the Secretary of State and shall be effective for a period of time not to exceed thirty (30) days unless sooner revoked.
