



Former Boehringer Ingelheim Employees Eligible To Apply for Trade Act Benefits

WETHERSFIELD, October 23, 2017 – Former employees of Boehringer Ingelheim, who worked in the company’s Ridgefield facility producing pharmaceuticals, were certified on October 17 as eligible to apply for federal Trade Adjustment Assistance.

The Connecticut Labor Department is mailing an eligibility notice regarding potential benefits to all affected employees and is providing information on how to apply for benefits. Employees eligible to apply for federal benefits are those who are or will be totally or partially separated from employment due to lack of work on or after September 7, 2016, and on or before October 17, 2019.

Available assistance may include training, income support in the form of Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA), and job search and relocation allowances for qualified workers who seek or obtain employment outside their normal commuting areas. Individuals 50 years of age and older who return to lower-paying work may be eligible to receive Reemployment Trade Adjustment Assistance (RTAA) wage subsidies.

Workers who believe they may qualify, yet do not receive eligibility information, are urged to contact their nearest *American Job Center* for information and assistance. Those who need to apply for unemployment benefits are reminded that new claims are now filed online at www.FileCTUI.com.
